
## adsorption dryer



The oil-less JUN-AIR compressors are available with an adsorption dryer. The dryer is designed for continuous operation, ensuring a constant supply of clean, dry air. The level of moisture left in the compressed air is described as the pressure dew point (PDP). This is the point at which moisture would condense if the compressed air temperature was to fall below the level stated. When fitted with a dryer, the oil-less compressors provide a pressure dew point as low as -40°C. Bacteria become inactive at a pressure dew point below -23°C and may subsequently be removed. The risk of corrosion is eliminated at -30°C.

The range of dryers includes three sizes. JUN-AIR compressors designated with a "D" followed by a letter in the model description (e.g. 2000-40MD2) is fitted with an adsorption dryer. The figure after "D" refers to the size of the dryer.
